Our organisers are made exclusively from bridle leather, and follow an elegant, time-tested design featuring curved full-length pockets back and front, a sturdy six-ring binder mechanism and a classic brass stud closure. The **GLENROYAL** mark embossed inside the front cover guarantees that each organiser has been individually quality checked to ensure many years of faithful service.

#### MATERIALS & CARE

Bridle leather is vegetable tanned cowhide that has been finished with oils and waxes. The name derives from its original use in making bridles — the leather straps used to attach horse reins. It is very strong and long lasting, and is also very beautiful and naturally produced. The vegetable tanning process uses natural ingredients from vegetable (as opposed to mineral) sources.

During the finishing process, the leather is impregnated with oils and waxes to make it strong, and keep it supple. The white deposit sometimes seen on bridle leather is wax migrating to the surface of the leather. The leather, if brushed with a soft cloth or a clean brush, will buff back to a beautiful shine. The whiteness is a sign much appreciated by connoisseurs of fine leather.



Bridle leather is designed to be an 'open' leather. That is to say, the grain is not sealed and remains permeable. If it gets wet it should be left to dry naturally, without direct heat. If it needs cleaning, it may be wiped periodically with a damp cloth and left to dry. An occasional application of "dubbin" will keep the leather supple and prevent it from drying out and cracking.
